BYU Men's Cross Country finishes in Top 20 at NCAA

The BYU Men's Cross Country team finished 16th in the nation at the 2002 NCAA Cross Country Championships today at Indiana State University. They scored 443 points. "Our goals and expectations were a lot higher, but everybody just didn't have their best races today," said Ed Eyestone, Head Men's Coach. "Kip's had the injury (a sore hip) for a couple weeks now. He still gutted it out and ran a strong race, being this was his first time at Nationals. He'll be back even better next year."

Eyestone said they are proud of their performance, though they had hoped for a higher finish.

"Even with the guys not running their best races we still finished in the top-20," Eyestone said. "We might have been tired from two consecutive 10k races, but the guys still gave it their best shot."
